



## Sports Premium Overview

The Sports premium funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

Playing sport helps to keep people healthy and is good for communities. Playing sport at school or in a local club is also the first step to competition at the highest level, which helps improve our reputation as a sporting nation, and contributes to economic growth.

But when people leave school they often stop playing sports, which means people can't fulfil their sporting potential, and can lead to a less healthy lifestyle. We want to get more people playing sport safely from a young age, and help them keep playing sport throughout their life, no matter what their economic or social background.

Maintained schools and academies must publish, on their website, information about their use of the PE and Sport Grant allocation.

Schools should publish the amount of grant received; how it has been spent (or will be spent) and what impact the school has seen on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment as a result, to help to ensure that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

### Impact

The confidence of the teaching staff has increased so that as a consequence the quality and breadth of the curriculum in a variety of sports such as gymnastics, cricket and tennis has improved.

### Objective

## Sports Package with high School.

£1,000

The package enables pupils to participate in a number of sporting festivals and tournaments throughout the year. It also provides training for older children to lead play.

To provide the opportunity to engage and compete in wide range of sporting experiences. Also for older children to be trained in delivering play activities for coaching skills.

### Impact
