St Laurence's Church of England Primary School celebrates NACE Challenge Award second accreditation

The National Association for Able Children in Education (NACE) has named St Laurence's Church of England Primary School, Ludlow, the 176th school to be accredited with the NACE Challenge Award for a second time. The award is given in recognition of school-wide commitment to high-quality provision for more able learners, within the context of challenge for all.

NACE CEO Rob Lightfoot said: "St Laurence's Church of England Primary School has worked hard to attain reaccreditation through the NACE Challenge Award. It has displayed a continued commitment to develop an environment in which all learners are challenged and supported to be the best they can be."

The award is based on the NACE Challenge Framework, which sets out criteria for highquality provision for more able learners within a wider ethos of challenge for all. The framework is available as part of the NACE Challenge Development Programme – a suite of resources developed by NACE to help schools evaluate and improve their provision for more able learners.

NACE's assessor reported: "Strong leadership promotes the needs of able learners with an emphasis on 'Challenge for all' in everyday school activities. The leadership and staff have reviewed the curriculum which is rich and broad, focused on knowledge, skills and the values the school promotes.

"Talents are nurtured by staff with a rich array of enrichment opportunities available meaning students can flourish across and beyond the curriculum.

"Pupils enjoy learning and feel challenged, particularly when engaging in analytical tasks and leadership opportunities. Students speak positively about their curriculum and feel encouraged to think critically."

The experience and evidence gathered by Challenge Award-accredited schools also shows that effective strategies to improve provision for the more able are likely to have a positive impact on the achievement of a much wider group of learners. To attain the Challenge Award, schools must complete a detailed self-evaluation using the NACE Challenge Framework, submit a portfolio of supporting evidence, and undertake assessment by a NACE associate. The assessment process includes examination of school data and key documents; lesson observations; and interviews with school leaders, learners, parents and governors.

CEO Rob Lightfoot said, "The Challenge Award is presented in recognition of whole-school commitment to and achievement in providing effective challenge and support for all – spanning school leadership, curriculum, teaching and learning, processes for identification and tracking, extracurricular opportunities, strong communication and partnerships, and ongoing evaluation."

St Laurence's Church of England Primary School will now remain part of the international community of Challenge Award-accredited schools which have demonstrated a sustained and effective commitment to meeting the needs of more able learners, and an interest in sharing expertise for the wider benefit of the education community.



Take part in sports, arts, cooking, forest schools and lots more fun activities, happening across the county. Free nutritious meals will be provided at each session.

There are free places available on the programme for children and young people aged 4 (in reception class or equivalent) to 16, who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals.

There are a limited number of free places available for children and young people who are not in receipt of benefits-related free school meals but meet a wider eligibility criterion (see www.shropshire.gov.uk.haf / email HAF.programme@ shropshire.gov.uk for more details).

How to Book

Please book spaces directly with the organisations running the holiday clubs.

What you need to do:

- Use the electronic What's On Guide and searchable Timetable to find which holiday club is suitable for your child/ren. Electronic copies of the Guide will be sent to you by your child/rens school and are also available at: www.shropshire.gov.uk.haf.
- Book onto activity by contacting the organisation running the holiday club direct, using the contact details in the Guide.
- 3. When making a booking, please quote your unique HAF Code (see box below).
- If your child/ren has SEND (Special Educational Needs & Disabilities) or receives any extra help at school, before booking onto activity, please contact the holiday club to discuss your child/s needs.
- Any queries you have about your booking or the activities on offer, please contact the organisation running the holiday club directly.
- If you meet the wider eligibility criteria, please contact, HAF.programme@shropshire.gov.uk for information about referrals onto the programme.

The unique code entitles your child/ren to attend 16 sessions of free holiday activity in Shropshire during the summer holidays 2024. Please don't use this code to book onto more than 16 sessions of activity or to book onto multiple programmes of activity with different providers, happening at the same time.

This code is individual to your child/s school and is not transferable to other children.
